Environment, Transport and Municipal Roads Commission

The municipal advisory commissions play an important role in ensuring that citizens are involved in the political life of the municipality. These advisory municipal commissions are responsible for making recommendations to the municipal authorities and for adopting positions on issues within their respective areas of competence. The opinion of the commission is always advisory in nature.

For the Environment, Transport and Municipal Roads Commission, these recommendations focus on the three areas mentioned above. At present, our commission has just over 20 members. For all commissions, the members must be approved by the municipal council at the beginning of the legislative period.

The activities of the past two years have included the organization of Tree Day, the municipality's major clean-up, and recommendations on which municipal roads should be renovated during the year.

Over the past two years, a survey has also been carried out in the four villages of our municipality in order to identify potential improvements in road safety and biodiversity.

It is an advisory commission and, according to Article 50 of the School Law of February 6, 2009, has a range of tasks.

It consists, among others, of a president, who is usually the mayor, members of the municipal council, school staff members, and parent representatives.

After each municipal election, the commission is reconstituted.

FC Jeunesse Useldange



FC Jeunesse Useldange is a Luxembourgish football club based in Useldange. The club was founded on August 12, 1945, and has now proudly celebrated its 80th anniversary.

The club plays its matches in Useldange and operates two football pitches at two nearby locations. The training pitch and locker rooms are located on rue de la Gare, while the main pitch still often called the “new pitch,” although it was inaugurated back in 1993 is situated on rue de Boevange. This year, renovation work is planned for the training pitch, including the installation of synthetic turf to ensure optimal training conditions.

At present, the club has 405 members.

The Seniors 1 team has been playing for 6 years now in the 1st Division of the FLF championship. The club’s biggest recent achievements include reaching the playoff match for promotion to the Ehrenpromotion in the 2021/22 season, unfortunately losing to Bissen, and reaching the final of the FLF Cup this year, where we narrowly lost to Lorentzweiler.

The club's second team has been competing in the 2nd Reserve Division since the 2024/25 season. Both senior squads are under the guidance of our coaching staff: Patrick Grettlich (head coach), Samir Kalabic, Théo Malget, and Hugo Correia.

In addition to the two senior teams in the FLF championship, our club also has a veterans' team and is represented in almost every category of the youth championship.

Our club is also well known for organizing the Medieval Festival, an event that brings the entire community together around football, history and celebration. The Useldange Medieval Festival is one of the largest events in our region, attracting thousands of visitors each year, and takes place on the site surrounding the castle.


Other well-known events include the Castle Ride, a cycling tour with various routes, the youth camp during the Pentecost holidays, and the children's carnival.

Les Amis du Prieuré d'Useldange Asbl

The stated objective of the Asbl “Les Amis du Prieuré d'Useldange”, founded on July 15, 2020, by a dozen people, is the preservation of our local heritage as well as the study and exploration of our shared history, that of Useldange, its neighboring villages, and the surrounding area.

Unfortunately, as we see every day, the villages of our municipality are also becoming increasingly poor in terms of preserved historic buildings, thereby losing much of their identity, charm, and character. The association aims to actively contribute to greater respect for our historical heritage and, in particular, to raise awareness among young people of the importance of architectural heritage.

At the heart of our activities stands the old Benedictine priory of Useldange, whose origins go back to the 12th century. One of our first major successes was obtaining official classification of the endangered archaeological site of the priory under the new law of February 25, 2022. Furthermore, we have gained the attention of our national institutions, which have financed and carried out precise analyses of the preserved buildings. We are also very proud that our Asbl has, in the meantime, become a recognized point of contact for researchers, students, authors, and numerous other institutions.

Under the name “Aurora”, the Asbl launched an interesting project three years ago within the framework of a postdoctoral research initiative, supported by the Œuvre Nationale de Secours Grande-Duchesse Charlotte, the Fondation Loutsch-Weydert, the Aureus Ars & Scientia Asbl, the municipality of Useldange, and several neighboring municipalities. This innovative project, which continues to receive funding from INRA, will shed new light on historic sites around Useldange.

In 2024, the Friends of the Priory successfully brought Jemp Schuster's radio play "*The Witch Trial of Katrin Theis in Useldange*" to the stage. The story of Katrin Theis' trial from the year 1624 was even taken up as a topic by the Useldange school classes.

Through regular conferences and round tables - which we both attend and organize ourselves - we strive to bring local history closer to our members and the people of the community, and to raise awareness of our shared heritage.

Engaging publications also allow us to reach a wider audience. A large-scale exhibition is planned for the near future. We will continue to do everything we can to inspire people with our heritage and local history.

Gaart an Heem Useldeng Asbl

The association Gaart an Heem Useldeng (originally called “Amis de la fleur”) was founded on January 16, 1927. From 1929 onwards, the association was part of the “Ligue du Coin de Terre et du Foyer,” as it was long known, and from 1939 there already existed a brochure referring to “Garten und Heim” or “Gaart an Heem.”

On May 22, 2022, we founded an Asbl, and since then the association has officially borne the name “Gaart an Heem Asbl Gemeng Useldeng”.

Our members come not only from our municipality but also from outside. At present, we have 188 members, and we are delighted to welcome every new one.

Our regular activities throughout the year include the general assembly with Mother’s Day celebration, the St. Nicholas celebration with the children, and a day trip for our members. Dear new and long-standing residents of the municipality of Useldange,

allow us to briefly introduce ourselves: We are the “lewerlenger Bréckestäiler”, known as IBS for short, and we have been active since 2022. As our name suggests, we are a small club from lewerleng, made up of a group of dedicated people who want to bring more life to our village. Of course, we also rely on a number of motivated helpers, without whom our events would never be possible.

Our little bistro, located on the first floor of the old school in Everlange, is without a doubt the heart of our association. We transformed a former classroom into a cozy and friendly space, where, with great joy, we serve an aperitif on the first Sunday of every month from 10:30 a.m. onwards to all sociable residents. At first, we thought only locals would show up, but our bistro now attracts many guests from all villages of the municipality and even from further away.

Since life is not only about gathering at the bistro, we also take part every year in the Christmas market at the castle, where we flame-grill salmon over an open fire, accompanied by a different specialty each year - whether it be mushrooms, a hearty soup, or something else to warm the body and soul. A barbecue, drinks, and marshmallows for the children are, of course, also available.

To chase away winter, we decided to organize a “Buergbrennen” in Iewerleng on Castle Sunday. Since there are already several such bonfires in the municipality, we created a special “Children’s Buergbrennen”. From 3 p.m., children can make their own torches, carry them in the torchlight procession, and place them around 5:30 p.m. at the bonfire to light it. Afterwards, there is a small bite to eat, then home for a shower and off to bed because school awaits the next morning! Anyone who still has energy can head to Useldange to join the “Club des Jeunes” for their own bonfire and a pleasant evening in good company.

After four or five Sunday aperitifs at our bistro, summer finally arrives. On the Saturday before July 15th, we host our “Duck Race” on the Atert - a fun race with over 1,000 ducks competing for great prizes. It’s a day especially for children, while parents can relax and chat together, the kids can let off steam in the safe play area with a bouncy castle, Bobby-Car track, and more.

In short, the “Iewerlenger Bréckestäiler” are an association committed to the well-being of everyone - because it brings us joy and because we want to connect people.

So don’t hesitate, come and visit us. You are all most welcome!

Indiaca is a team sport that is played in a similar way to volleyball but with a few small differences. Instead of a ball, we use an Indiaca shuttle - a 25 cm feathered ball that is hit with the flat hand. Each team consists of 5 players on a court that is smaller than a volleyball court.

Currently, there are 5 clubs in the country. The Indiaca Nethoppers Useldingen was founded in 2004 and since then we have actively participated in the national championship as well as in the cup competition. We field women's, men's, and mixed teams. Players from Useldange have already taken part in World Championships, and this year we are proud to be represented with 6 players and 3 coaches at the 7th World Championship in Estonia.

Our training takes place on Wednesday evenings from 8:00 pm to 10:00 pm, running from mid-September to mid-July.

The “Kultur- a Buergfrënn Useldeng a.s.b.l.”, originally founded in 2011 under the name “Buergfrënn Useldeng”, has been operating under its current name since 2016, following its merger with the municipal cultural commission.


In 2024, the Syndicat d’Initiative was integrated into the structure of the a.s.b.l., which meant that the tasks and responsibilities previously carried out by the Syndicat were transferred to “Kultur- a Buergfrënn Useldeng”. The association continues these missions in the same spirit and will also, in the future, organize events such as the “Ovation of the Newly Elected.”


In 2025, the Comité du Souvenir was also incorporated into the structure of “Kultur- a Buergfrënn Useldeng.” Since then, the association has been committed to ensuring that the memory of the Second World War is preserved and that this chapter of history is not forgotten.

The association’s main intention is to preserve and promote the historical and cultural heritage of Useldange. Alongside the animation and promotion of Useldange Castle, the management and development of “ManuKultura” are among its core activities. “ManuKultura” hosts a wide variety of courses and cultural activities, ranging from ceramics workshops and painting and dance classes to blues evenings and theater performances.

The Nature&Environment Section of Canton Redange was founded in 1985 under the name Nature and Bird Protection. It is one of the sections in the country with the largest number of members.

The section's activities include:

- Organizing nature walks, e.g. "With the Green Man through the Forest"
- Activities in cooperation with the Centrale Ornithologique, such as observing swifts at Useldange Castle or bird migration at the Sëller Héicht

- Organizing fruit tree pruning courses and tree planting actions
- Crafting, installing, and maintaining nesting boxes
- Writing articles on species protection and the environment for the municipal newsletters
- Promoting the use of recycled paper, especially in the municipalities and schools of the Redange canton
- Exhibiting and selling books on animals and plants at the Kropemannsfest in Redange
- Participating in the Christmas market in Useldange


The section's General Assembly is held every year in a different municipality of the canton. On this occasion, the section offers the respective municipality to realize a nature project, to which it contributes financially. In this way, several valuable projects have already been carried out.

Pompjeesfrënn Useldeng Asbl

The CISUS is one of around 100 rescue centres in Luxembourg and an integral part of the CGDIS (Corps Grand-Ducal d'Incendie et de Secours).

Under the leadership of Claude Kaufmann, the CISUS is responsible for all operational firefighting and rescue services in the municipality of Useldingen.

Among the special tasks of CISUS are, in addition to the decontamination module and the transport of decontaminated equipment, a specialized water supply and pumping module. The cultural and social aspects are handled by the Amicale, known under the name Pompjeesfrënn Gemeng Useldeng a.s.b.l.. It ensures the social life of the CIS by organizing events and excursions, communal meals after exercises, the traditional Buergbrennen in Schandel, the Christmas market stand by the castle, and much more.







A particularly important area is youth work. The youth fire brigade (ages 6-16) learns the basic skills of firefighting and rescue services in a playful way. In addition to regular training sessions, varied activities are also included, such as ice skating, swimming outings, or multi-day youth camps.

In 1923, Péitchen Theis from Rippweiler had a Lourdes grotto built in his village, after a hunting accident made it impossible for him to go on pilgrimage to Lourdes. Since then, every year on August 15th, on the Feast of the Assumption, a Mass has been celebrated at the grotto.

In 1966, an association named “Oeuvres Paroissiales de Rippweiler” was founded, based in Rippweiler.

The Theis family donated the grotto to the association, whose mission is the establishment and promotion of all religious, social, and charitable works of the Rippweiler branch, as well as any activity related to the acquisition, construction, maintenance, and management of movable and immovable property, particularly the grotto.

The history of this “monument” was retraced in 2023 on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the “Rippweiler Grott” in a 30-minute documentary film, which can be ordered from us and is certainly worth watching.

We have also organized a whole series of more open activities in the church of Rippweiler, in order to bring new life to this place where very few Masses are still celebrated: celebrations for peace, moments of meditation, youth Stations of the Cross in collaboration with the KAD, film evenings...


In the future, too, we will continue to plan small activities to keep our village alive and to create opportunities for encounters.

Who we are?

The Schandel Village Friends (“Schandeler Duerffrënn”) is an association made up of five residents of Schandel, who have been organizing events in the village for five years, bringing people together to share enjoyable moments.

What do we do?

- *The Advent gathering (“Adventspatt”):* shortly before Christmas, the Duerfrënn invite the village to a convivial evening in a warm Christmas atmosphere in front of the Cultural Centre.
